

The process of review may be started with those mechanisms whose mandate will be expired within one year.

A country reviewed under one procedure should not be simultaneously subjected to other procedures.

The mandates, mechanisms, functions of the CHR can be clustered together according to the themes of their work, which may be incorporated in the agenda of the council.

Issues such as economic, social and cultural rights, right to self determination, violations of human rights in Palestine, right to development, racism, defamation of religions and foreign occupation should be included in the agenda of the council

Review process should focus on:

- 1- review of the special mechanisms and procedures of the CHR in order to reform and rationalize them.

- 2- Sub – commission

- 3- 1503 procedure

- 4- Agenda

To prepare the agenda of the Council, the following two primary sources may be used

- (i)- Resolution 60/251 and

- (ii)- agenda and the work done by the CHR during last 60 years.

Based on this, a list of agenda items for the Council should be drawn. This should be done through consultations and in a non – selective manner to ensure that issues of importance for all delegations are incorporated in the agenda of the Council.

Agenda Item 9 in its current format must be eliminated, given the fact that it was the main source of politicization, double standards and selectivity which caused the credibility crisis that destroyed the CHR.
