Mr. President.

The report of the Special Rapporteur is couched in a manner that conveys a very adversarial stance with the State concerned. Notably, the usage of certain language which disparages the Government can be counter-productive.

My delegation observes that the report contains some recommendations which, in our view, continuer to the principle offstate sovereignty and deviated from the spirit of positive engagement. Recommendations such as attaching conditions to trade and travel restrictions for Government officials do not lend themselves to a fruitful human rights discourse.

We emphasise the importance of adopting a collaborative attitude in the promotion and protection of human rights worldwide. This will prove to be more beneficial for all involved both in the short- and long-run.
